Till the buckwheat into the soil at first flower. Keep the garden area tilled weekly for 1-2 weeks and plant cereal rye between September 1-15 as a smother crop at a rate of 1 lb. of seed per 1,000 sq. ft. After seeding, lightly rake in the seed to a depth of ½-1 inch.
